

2024 CMAS (World Underwater Confederation) Scientific Committee)Underwater Cultural Heritage Activities in the frame of UNESCO 2001 Convention

The most important steps regarding the protection of CMAS's underwater cultural heritage have been linked to the signing of an agreement in this field with UNESCO in June 2023. With this agreement, CMAS included the protection of Underwater Cultural Heritage into official training programs, and training programs were started in various country federations such as CMAS member Türkiye and Portugal and Argentina.



CMAS organized two international organizations in 2024 together with UNESCO Headquarters and Akdeniz University, a full member of the UNESCO UniTwin Underwater Archeology Network. The first of these is the CMAS-UNESCO Scientific Diving Training prepared for African Countries. The other event is the underwater cultural heritage symposium



 Participation of 20 underwater archeology professionals from the Ministry of Cultures or relevant institutions of 14 African countries (Senegal, Mozambique, Algeria, Tunisia, Egypt, Cabo Verde, Kenya, Maritius, Comoros, Cibuti, Madagaskar, Eritre, Gambia and Morocco) and 18 underwater archaeology professors, marine scientists and hyperbaric medicine specialists from 4 European Countries (Türkiye, Portugal, Italy and Poland) including ICOMOS-ICUCH members.

















The symposium organized in parallel with the Africa program was held on 16-19 May 2024, and CMAS international UCH trainings were discussed in this program
